TOPIC: Commission on Data Practices and Personal Data Privacy

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Overview

Creates a Legislative Commission on Data Practices and Personal Data Privacy.

Section

- 1** **Legislative Commission on Data Practices.** Creates the Legislative Commission on Data Practices and Personal Data Privacy to study issues relating to government data practices and individuals' personal data privacy rights, and to review legislation on these issues.

The commission consists of four senators and four House members, with two from the majority caucus and two from the minority caucus in each chamber. Authorizes the commission to elect up to four former legislators with experience in data practices and privacy issues to serve as nonvoting members of the commission. Legislative members would serve two-year terms. Provides that the chair alternates between the House and Senate each biennium. Requires legislative staff to provide administrative support and research assistance to the commission.

This section is effective immediately and is sunset June 30, 2017.

- 2** **Initial appointments and meeting.** Requires initial appointments to be made by June 1, 2014, and requires the first meeting to be convened by June 15, 2014.
