# **Overview**

Removes licensure requirements for hairstyling and makeup services.

# Summary

## Section Description

#### 1 Hairstyling.

Defines hairstyling as cleaning, drying, arranging, or styling hair in ways that do not include cutting, coloring, or chemically altering the hair.

## 2 Makeup services.

Defines makeup services as makeup application, including airbrushing, but not including permanent makeup, tattooing, or facial services.

## 3 Exemptions.

Exempts anyone who performs only hairstyling and makeup services from all the cosmetology regulations as long as a four-hour approved course on applicable health, safety, and infection-control matters and state law has been completed.

#### 4 Exemption.

Exempts facilities where only hairstyling and makeup services are performed from the requirements of salon licensure.

## 5 **Board of Cosmetologist Examiners.**

Reduces the fiscal year 2021 appropriation to the Board of Cosmetologist Examiners by \$12,000.
