## Overview

This bill includes a fracture of bone or cartilage or a fracture, chip or loss of a tooth within the definition of substantial bodily harm.

- **1 Substantial Bodily Harm.** Current law defines substantial bodily harm to include a fracture of any bodily member. Changes this definition to a fracture of the bone or cartilage within any bodily member or a fracture, chip or loss of a tooth, where the fracture, chip or loss of a tooth does not result in great bodily harm.
- 2 Effective date. August 1, 1999, for crimes committed on or after that date.
