Overview

Places a 30-day time limit on the right of a defendant to challenge in district court the amount of court-ordered restitution he or she is required to pay.

- Dispute; evidentiary burden; procedures. Places a 30-day time limit on the right of a defendant to challenge in district court the amount of court-ordered restitution he or she is required to pay. This time period begins to run when the defendant is notified of the amount of restitution requested or when the defendant is sentenced, whichever occurs later. Bars defendants from challenging restitution after the 30-day time period has run.
- **Effective date.** August 1, 1999, for crimes committed on or after that date.
