## Bill Summary —

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**Subject:** Traffic-impacted metropolitan city street account

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## Overview

This bill creates a traffic-impacted metropolitan city street account in the county state-aid highway fund to provide money for cities in the metropolitan area under 5,000 population that have at least one heavily-traveled street. Money would be distributed on the basis of total street miles in each such city.

## **Section**

- Allocation to traffic-impacted metropolitan city street account. Provides that .0385 percent of money in the county state-aid highway fund, after deductions for administrative costs, the disaster account, research account, and state park road account, must be allocated to a traffic-impacted metropolitan city street account.
- 2 **Traffic-impacted metropolitan city street account.** Establishes the account and provides for its distribution.

**Subdivision 1. Definition.** Defines a "traffic-impacted metropolitan city" as a city in the metropolitan area with a population under 5,000 that has at least one street under the city's jurisdiction with an average annual daily traffic of 12,000 or more vehicles.

- **Subd. 2. Account created.** Creates the account.
- **Subd. 3. Apportionment.** Provides that funds in the account must be apportioned to each county in the metropolitan area in proportion to the total miles of city streets in traffic-impacted metropolitan cities in the county bears to the total miles of city streets in traffic-impacted metropolitan cities in the metropolitan area.
- **Subd. 4. Distribution to counties.** Provides for distribution of money in the account to the counties.
- **Subd. 5. Distribution to cities.** Directs counties receiving money from the account to pay to each traffic-impacted metropolitan city in the county in proportion to that city's street mileage compared to the street mileage of other such cities in the county.

**Subd. 6. When distribution not made.** Provides that no distribution from the account may be made in a year if it would reduce any county's state-aid distribution below its level for the previous year.

**Subd. 7. Expenditure.** Allows a city receiving money from the account to spend it only on construction, reconstruction, and maintenance of streets under its jurisdiction.
