This bill repeals a law that requires a town to have a stallion, bull, boar, or ram that is running at large castrated if the owner, after being notified, continues to allow the animal to run at large. The town then has a lien on the animal to cover the costs. The chair of a town board that refuses or neglects to perform the duties under this law is guilty of a misdemeanor.
