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**Subject:** Feedlots; Regulation Transferred to Ag Dept.

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## Overview

House File 495 transfers authority and responsibility for feedlot rulemaking and feedlot permitting from the pollution control agency (PCA) to the department of agriculture (MDA).

## Section

- 1 Feedlots.
  - **Subd. 1. Authority of commissioner.** Transfers authority for issuing permits and regulating feedlots from the PCA to the MDA. The transfer is effective July 1, 2001.
  - **Subd. 2. Animal unit.** Transfers details on how to calculate animal units from PCA statutes (Minnesota Statutes, chapter 116) to the MDA statutes (chapter 17).
- **Permittee qualifications.** Transfers details on minimum qualifications for an applicant to receive an animal feedlot permit from PCA statutes to the MDA statutes.
- Counties; processing of applications for animal lot permits. Transfers from PCA to MDA the optional program of delegating feedlot responsibility to individual counties. Language moved includes definitions; the statement of county responsibilities; exceptions; discharges; an instruction for interagency, intergovernmental, and public-private cooperation; rulemaking authority; a provision for more stringent county ordinances; and limits on requiring upgrades.
- 4 **Notice of application for livestock feedlot permit.** Transfers details on the required public notice before a permit to build or expand an animal feedlot from PCA statutes to the MDA statutes.
- 5 **Livestock odor.** Transfers regulation of livestock odor from PCA statutes to the MDA statutes.
- **Best management practices.** Transfers from the PCA to the MDA responsibility for developing voluntary best management practices for odor control at feedlots.
- 7 **Disposition of carcasses.** Transfers from the PCA to the MDA responsibility for distributing information on best management practices for dead animal disposal.

- 8 **Major facility.** Strikes from PCA statutory language the part of the definition of "major facility" that includes a feedlot with 1,000 or more animal units.
- Authority of commissioner. Strikes from PCA statutory language the responsibility for permitting animal feedlot facilities.
- 10 **Feedlot zoning ordinances.** Removes a requirement that a county proposing a feedlot ordinance must notify the PCA. (The county still must notify MDA.)
- Agricultural operation not a nuisance. Changes a reference to feedlot rules from PCA to MDA.
- Repealer. Repeals the sections and subdivisions of statute that had given feedlot rulemaking and permit authority to the PCA.
