Overview

Creates a new felony: attempted manufacture of methamphetamine. Repeals an existing law that partially addresses the same criminal conduct.

Section

- 1** **Manufacture Crimes.** Creates the crime of attempted manufacture of methamphetamine. A person is guilty of the crime if the person possesses any chemical reagents or precursors with the intent to manufacture methamphetamine. Defines chemical reagents and precursors. Establishes the penalty for violation as up to 30 years in prison or a \$1,000,000 fine, or both.
- 2** **Repealer.** Repeals a current law that makes possession of certain chemical reagents and precursors a misdemeanor.
- 3** **Effective Date.** August 1, 2003.
