**Subject:** Allowing school districts to opt out of certain state mandates

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## **Overview**

Establishes a process and conditions by which school districts may opt out of certain state mandates.

#### **Section**

#### 1 Definitions.

- **Subd. 1. Scope.** Declares that the terms in this section have the meaning given them.
- **Subd. 2. School district.** Defines school district to mean a common, independent or special school district but not a charter school.
- **Subd. 3. State mandate.** Defines state mandate to mean a state law or rule that affects local government structure, operation, services, programs or financing and imposes a cost on local government, decreases revenue without decreasing required programs or services, establishes local goals or policies, makes local government or its officials liable for failing to comply with a law or rule, restricts the ability of local government to operate or obtain funding, or alters federal law requirements.

#### 2 Opt out procedures.

**Subd. 1. Local procedure.** Allows a school district to formally resolve to opt out of a state mandate except a mandate listed under section 3. Specifies the notice requirements and procedures for this process. Requires a school district to file each resolution with the state auditor and pay a \$75 filing fee that the state auditor may adjust.

- **Subd. 2. State procedure.** (a) Requires the state auditor to post information on districts' opt out resolutions and to notify the legislature and the revisor of statutes.
- (b) Directs the revisor to publish a list of school districts and the laws from which the districts are opting out and to provide finding aids for statute users.
- **Subd. 3. Threshold for opt out; certification; effective date.** Waives a statutory mandate at the end of the current legislative session if 10 percent of school districts resolve to opt out of a mandate.
- **Subd. 4. Later opt outs.** Waives a statutory mandate for other school districts that opt out of a mandate after the waiver of the mandate goes into effect.

## 3 Exceptions.

- **Subd. 1. Scope.** Excludes the laws listed in this section from the provisions under section 2.
- **Subd. 2. Election law.** Excludes election laws from the provisions under section 2.
- **Subd. 3. Administration of the property tax system.** Excludes property tax laws from the provisions under section 2.
- **Subd. 4. Accounting, financial management procedures; audit requirements.** Excludes accounting, financial management and audit requirements applicable to school districts from the provisions under section 2.
- **Subd. 5. Nonpublic students.** Excludes laws governing nonpublic schools and students from the provisions under section 2.
