Overview

This bill amends three provisions in current trespass law. First, the bill prohibits a person from returning, without consent, to the property of another within one year after being told to leave the property and not to return. Currently, a person may return after 30 days have elapsed from the time of being told to leave and not to return.

Second, the bill prohibits a person from returning to school property, without the principal's consent, within one year after being told by the school's principal or designee to leave and not to return. Currently, a person may return after six months have elapsed from the time of being told to leave and not to return.

Third, the bill prohibits a person from entering a locked or posted aggregate mining site. This expands on the current law which prohibits a person from entering a locked or posted construction site.
