Allows a slow-moving vehicle emblem to be a red-bordered red-orange triangle visible at night from 100 to 600 feet when directly in front of a vehicle with low-beam headlights, and visible at night from 1,000 feet in ambient lighting below 2 lux when viewed from 1,000 feet directly behind the vehicle and at any angle up to 70 degrees from that point.

Requires the luminous intensity of the red-orange triangle to be between 40 and 80 candelas/m2. Requires the luminous intensity to not vary by more than ten percent as measured by comparing the luminous intensity at any two points on the triangle from any angle.
