### Overview

This bill removes reimbursement limits for animals destroyed by an order of the Board of Animal Health.

#### Section

- 1**      **General rule.** Requires the state to pay the full difference between the appraised value and salvage carcass value of each animal slaughtered because of tuberculosis, paratuberculosis, or brucellosis infection-currently the state is required to pay 2/3 of that amount. Removes a \$37.50 cap for grade animals and \$75 cap for a registered purebred.
- 2**      **Nonreactors; cattle eligible for test.** Removes the \$300 cap for grade animals and \$600 cap for registered purebred animals that are nonreactors to the brucellosis test and exposed cattle not eligible for testing.
