Overview

This bill raises the monetary thresholds for theft, issuing a dishonored check, and criminal damage to property in the first and third degrees.

Theft. Raises the following monetary thresholds for theft crimes:

Penalty	Current	Proposed
10-year felony	exceeds \$2,500	exceeds \$5,000
5-year felony	\$501-\$2,500	\$1,001-\$5,000
5-year felony w/certain prior offenses	\$251-\$500	\$501-\$1,000
(robbery, forgery, burglary, etc.)		
5-year felony involving grave robbing,	not more than \$500	not more than \$1,000
pillaging, auto theft, theft from		
government agencies or court records		
gross misdemeanor	\$251-\$500	\$501-\$1,000
misdemeanor	\$250 or less	\$500 or less

5-year felony	more than \$500	more than \$1,000
gross misdemeanor	\$251-\$500	\$501-\$1,000

Criminal damage to property in the first degree. Raises the following monetary thresholds for criminal damage to property in the first degree:

Penalty	Current	Proposed
5-year felony, first offense	more than \$500	more than \$1,000
5-year felony, second/subsequent	more than \$250	more than \$500

Criminal damage to property in the third degree. Raises the following monetary thresholds for criminal damage to property in the third degree:

Penalty	Current	Proposed
gross misdemeanor	\$251-\$500	\$501-\$1,000
gross misdemeanor, bias crime	not more than \$250	not more than \$500
