Overview

This bill authorizes the Minnesota Department of Public Safety to cancel the driver's license of a person whose license had been revoked for certain DWI or criminal vehicular homicide offenses, was paying the reinstatement fee and surcharge in two installment payments, and did not pay the second installment payment.

Under current law, under such situations the driver's license becomes expired and a person is able to get a license in another state. By revoking the license as authorized in the bill, the person would be unable to get a license elsewhere until the remaining installment payment is paid.

Section

- 1 Cancellation.** Creates a cross reference to a list of circumstances under which a person's driver's license can be cancelled.
- 2 Reinstatement fee and surcharges allocated and appropriated.** Authorizes cancellation of the driver's license of someone who does not pay the second installment payment for license reinstatement after revocation for certain DWI or criminal vehicular homicide offenses.
