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Subject:	Authorizing staff development revenue to be spent on CPR and AED training	
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## Overview

A school district must reserve two percent of its basic general education revenue for staff development activities. Minnesota's staff development statutes prescribe qualifying staff development activities and apportion the staff development funds such that 50 percent of the funds must be distributed to the school buildings for the site teams to use according to their plans, 25 percent is reserved for district wide activities, and the remaining 25 percent of the funds must be distributed in grants to school sites for best practice methods.

This bill authorizes a school district to use a portion of its staff development revenue for basic first aid training, focusing on CPR and the use of automatic external defibrillators (AEDs), before making the allocations to school sites.
