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Subject: Increasing the compulsory attendance age

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Overview

Requires students to stay in school through age 18 or graduation, whichever comes first. Also directs home school parents to report on providing instruction to students between ages 7 and 16.

Section

- Ages and terms. (a) Beginning in the 2012-2013 school year and later, requires every student between the ages of 7 and 18, instead of 16, to receive instruction unless the student completes graduation requirements before age 18.
- **Reports to superintendent.** Requires parents to report on providing instruction to home school students between the ages of 7 and 16.

Makes this section effective for the 2012-2013 school year and later.

- Habitual truant. Defines truancy in terms of the number of unexcused absences on a per school year basis: 7 school days per school year for elementary school students; and one or more class periods on 7 school days per school year for middle, junior, and senior high school students. Strikes language including as a truant those students ages 16 and 17 who have 7 unexcused absences and have not formally withdrawn from school.
- **Repealer.** Repeals effective for the 2012-2013 school year and later the provision (MS, section 120A.22, subdivision 8) allowing students ages 16 and 17 to withdraw from school.
