Subject: Prohibiting Bisphenol-A in products of children

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Section

- 1** **Definitions.** Adds § 325F.172. Defines the terms “child” and “children’s product” for the purposes of this act.

Provides an immediate effective date.
- 2** **Bisphenol-A in children’s products.** Adds § 325F.173. Prohibits manufacturers from selling new children’s products that contain bisphenol-A (BPA) beginning January 1, 2010, for most products, but beginning January 1, 2013, for infant formula containers.

Provides an immediate effective date.
- 3** **Replacement chemicals.** Adds § 325F.174. Limits on the types of chemicals that a manufacturer may use to replace BPA. Prohibits replacing BPA with a chemical that is “known to be a human carcinogen” or is “reasonably anticipated to be a human carcinogen,” or that is identified by the EPA as causing birth defects, hormone disruption, or harm to reproduction or development.

Provides an immediate effective date.
- 4** **Participation in interstate clearinghouse.** Adds § 325F.175. Permits the PCA to participate in the establishment and implementation of a multistate clearinghouse to identify children’s products that contain BPA and to evaluate safer alternatives.
