Overview

This bill contains policy and finance provisions to improve criminal offender reintegration into society upon release from incarceration.

Section

1 County Jail Re-entry Projects.

Subdivision 1. Purpose. To assist offenders who have mental illness, brain injury, chemical dependency or housing problems upon release from local jails.

Subd. 2. Grants. Directs the commissioner of corrections, in consultation with the commissioner of human services, to award grants to county boards for two-year offender re-entry pilot projects that target offenders with the problems listed in subdivision 1. Requires projects to have county agencies collaborate to provide a variety of suggested services.

Subd. 3. Applications. Sets forth minimum application content requirements.

Appropriations. Paragraph (a): Appropriates an unspecified amount to the commissioner of corrections to fund the grant program established in section 1.

Paragraph (b): Appropriates an unspecified amount to the commissioner of human services to fund discharge planning for offenders who have serious and persistent mental illness.
