State Government Operations		
1	Billing procedures. Authorizes MMB to bill up to \$10 million (instead of the current \$7.52 million) each year for statewide systems services provided to state agencies. This section is effective July 1, 2013.	
2	Budget reserve maximum . Sets the maximum amount for the general fund budget reserve at 4.1 percent of biennial expenditures and transfers for the preceding biennium.	
3	Additional revenue; priority . Provides that if a general fund forecast predicts a positive unrestricted balance at the close of a biennium, forecast balances in addition to amounts directed to the cash flow account and the budget reserve account must be allocated 50% to the budget reserve account until it reaches the maximum specified in the prior section and 50% to priorities specified in current law.	
4	Credit of proceeds. Requires that any premium received on or before December 1, 2012 on sale of bonds must be credited to the state bond fund, and that any premium received later must be credited either to the bond proceeds fund where it is used to reduce the part amount of the bonds issued or the	

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state bond fund.

Cancellation. Provides that if a premium received on the sale of bonds is credited to the bond

- proceeds fund, the corresponding bond authorization must be reduced accordingly.
- **Support.** Requires support for the EQB to be provided by the Pollution Control Agency (PCA).
- **Administration.** Requires the EQB to contract with the PCA for administrative services.
- **8** Enterprise real property. Amends a 2009 session law to provide that funds contributed for the enterprise real property system are available until June 30, 2013.
