This bill sets the population of a city to be 5,000 for purposes of eligibility to receive municipal state-aid street funding, if the city had a population of 5,000 or more at some point in the past but dropped down below 5,000 based on the 2010 federal census.

Under state law, certain transportation-related funds dedicated to cities for their municipal state-aid street systems are limited to cities having a population of at least 5,000. The population is generally calculated based on the most recent federal census. Minn. Const. Art. XIV. Minn. Stat. § 162.09.
