Restricts the class of offenders who are eligible for the Department of Corrections' boot camp program called Challenge Incarceration. Under the bill, the following offenders would not be eligible to participate in CIP:

- Ø an offender serving a sentence for a crime that resulted in death or great bodily harm to a victim or involved the discharge of a firearm;
- Ø an offender who served a sentence for an offense included in the prior bullet point and 5 years have not elapsed since the person's sentence expired;
- Ø an offender required to register as a predatory offender;
- Ø an offender who is referred for civil commitment as a sexually dangerous person or mentally ill and dangerous;
- Ø an offender with a recent incident of prison discipline; and
- Ø an offender subject to a suspended disciplinary sanction or a current loss of privileges.
