Overview

This bill modifies the CPR training requirements for child care centers. Current law requires at least one trained staff person to be present in the facility when children are present. This bill requires all teachers and assistant teachers to successfully complete CPR training, including CPR techniques for infants and children.

- 1 **Hannah's law.** Provides that this act may be cited as "Hannah's Law."
- 2 **Cardiopulmonary resuscitation.** Amends § 245A.40, subdivision 4.
 - Requires all child care center teachers and assistant teachers to successfully complete CPR training, including CPR for infants and children.
 - Additionally requires at least one staff person during field trips and when transporting children to be CPR trained, including CPR for infants and children.
 - Provides that this training must be completed within 90 days of hire, unless the individual has successfully completed CPR training within the previous three years.
 - Sets out the requirements for CPR training curriculum.
