# Bill Summary

**Subject:** Public-private partnership (PPP) pilot program

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### Overview

This bill establishes a pilot program for Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) or the Metropolitan Council to undertake up to three public-private partnership (PPP) projects for transportation infrastructure.

#### **Section**

- Public private partnership program. Establishes the program for up to three pilot projects, allows tolling only on new highway system capacity, authorizes MnDOT discretion in choice of financing mechanisms, directs creation of a cross-agency joint program office for advisory and oversight functions, and defines terms.
- Pilot program restrictions and project selection. Sets limits for the program, including: advertising in the State Register in some situations, prohibiting certain non-compete agreements, prohibiting permanent transfer of state infrastructure, requiring development under a new project, and identifying possible projects to select.
- **Evaluation and selection of private entity and project.** Requires use of a consultant in evaluating PPP proposals, outlines factors in evaluating and selecting projects, and directs the joint program office to review and identify whether projects serve the public interest.
- **Public-private agreement.** Outlines both required and allowable provisions in a PPP contract and requires review by the joint program office prior to execution of a contract.
- **Funding from federal government.** Authorizes acceptance of federal funds and entering into agreements with federal authorities. Requires the maximization of funds from nonstate sources and permits financing from multiple sources.

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#### **Section**

**Reporting.** Mandates an annual legislative report, due each August 1 starting in 2015, on the pilot program.

**Effective date.** Makes the pilot program go into effect following an appropriation for the joint program office, a consultant, and reporting costs.
