Bill Summary

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Overview

Seeks to eliminate obsolete provisions currently contained in law. Each section refers to a repealer, in the order of the bill.

Section

- Construction of laws of 1943, chapter 108. Repeals a limit put into law stating that the only forces which could be called to national service are those in the national guard or any other forces expressly made subject to this. Because Minnesota does not have a militia outside of the national guard, this restriction does not currently cover any armed force in the state.
- **Computing continuous service.** This issue has been addressed in federal law, and is redundant in state law.
- **Commission may be vacated; federal regulations.** Also addressed in federal law, rendering this redundant.
- **Surplus officers.** Same as above.
- 5 **Discharge for enlisted members.** Same as above.
- **6 Arms and uniforms.** Same as above.
- **Transportation hire and expense.** Federal process allows for, and state active personnel already do this.
- **8 Desertion.** Contained elsewhere in state and federal law, rendering this redundant.
