### Overview

This bill adds the following offenses to the definition of “crime of violence:” felony convictions for fifth-degree assault, domestic assault, and domestic assault by strangulation. Strikes felony vehicle theft and looting, and third-degree burglary.

**Background:** Under current law, a person who has been convicted of, adjudicated delinquent for, or convicted as an extended jurisdiction juvenile of a “crime of violence” is not entitled to ship, transport, possess, or receive a firearm for the person’s lifetime. In addition, the law provides various crime victim notification rights if an alleged offender is arrested or released from pre-trial detention for a “crime of violence.”
