Overview

This bill appropriates money for the Family Assets for Independence in Minnesota (FAIM) program.

The FAIM program is a matched savings project to help Minnesota low-wage earners build assets through:

- o purchase of a home;
- o pursuit of a higher education; or
- o launching of a small business.

This is accomplished by FAIM participants placing up to \$40 per month from their earned income into Family Asset Accounts (savings accounts) which will be matched 3-1 upon completion of asset contracts.

Appropriation. Appropriates \$500,000 for the 2014-2015 biennium from the general fund to the commissioner of human services for the FAIM program.
