Overview

This bill classifies certain data related to the Department of Transportation.

Section

- 1 Mileage-based user fees.** (a) Classifies a number of types of data collected by the Department of Transportation related to participation in the Minnesota road use test as nonpublic or private data.
 - (b) Permits disclosure of these data in summary form, as permitted by current law.
 - (c) Prohibits the Department of Transportation from disclosing data classified under this section except where required by a search warrant.
- 2 Construction manager/general contractor data.** (a) Classifies data related to the award of a certain construction manager/general contractor contracts, with a tiered approach.
 - (b) Classifies data at the time the commissioner of transportation solicits a request for qualifications.
 - (c) Requires disclosure of certain data when the commissioner of transportation announces the short list of qualified construction managers/general contractors.
 - (d) Classifies data at the time the commissioner of transportation solicits a request for proposals.
 - (e) Requires disclosure of certain data when the commissioner of transportation has completed the ranking of proposals and announces the selected construction manager/general

contractor.

(f) Classifies data related to contract negotiations with the construction manager/general contractor, until the contract is fully executed.

(g) Requires disclosure of all remaining data otherwise classified by this section, when the contract is fully executed.

(h) Provides that certain data remain classified if the commissioner of transportation rejects all responses to a request for proposals before a construction manager/general contractor contract is fully executed, with certain conditions specified in the bill.
