- Plan development criteria (Mighty Ducks). Adds renovation and indoor air quality improvements at existing indoor ice arenas to the list of priority projects for funding. Increases the cap on grants from \$100,000 to \$200,000.
- Authorization (housing infrastructure bonds). Authorizes proceeds to be used to finance acquisition of property to be leased by community land trusts to low- and moderate-income homebuyers, striking the limitation related to abandoned and foreclosed property. Provides that preference for permanent supportive housing proposals must be given to veterans as well as other individual and families meeting the criteria. Effective for bonds authorized in 2014 and thereafter.
- Additional authorization (housing infrastructure bonds). Authorizes the MHFA to issue up to \$80 million in housing infrastructure bonds. The bonds are not GO and not backed by state's full faith and credit.
- **Additional appropriation (housing infrastructure bonds).** Appropriates \$6,400,000 per year from the general fund to the MHFA for debt service on the agency housing infrastructure bonds issued, beginning in fiscal year 2015.
- 20 Appropriations given effect once.
- **Effective date.** Except as otherwise provided, effective the day following final enactment.
