Overview

Creates a Legislative Commission on Data Practices and Personal Data Privacy.

Section

1 Legislative Commission on Data Practices. Creates the Legislative Commission on Data Practices and Personal Data Privacy to study issues relating to government data practices and individuals' personal data privacy rights, and to review legislation on these issues.

The commission consists of five senators and five House members, with no more than three from the majority caucus in each chamber. Members would serve two-year terms. Provides that the chair alternates between the House and Senate each biennium. Requires legislative staff to provide administrative support and research assistance to the commission.
