Bill Summary

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Overview

This bill limits how residential communities can regulate solar energy systems.

Section

- Limits on certain residential solar energy systems prohibited. Prevents homeowners associations, common interest communities, and other residential communities from limiting a homeowner's use of solar energy when the homeowner owns a single-family dwelling, that is attached or detached, there are no upper and lower boundaries to the property, and the owner is responsible for the roof. This section does allow a homeowners association or common interest community, or other residential community, to impose other restrictions on the installation, maintenance, and location of the solar energy system.
- 2 Compliance with covenants, bylaws, and rules. Provides that apartment owners in a condominium under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 515, must comply with the terms provided in section 1.
- 3 Construction and validity of declaration and bylaws. Provides that declaration and bylaws applying to common interest communities under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 515B, must comply with the terms provided in section 1.
- **Powers of unit owners' association.** Provides that a unit owners' association cannot make declarations or bylaws that do not comply with section 1.
