Overview

This bill includes a number of technical and other policy changes related to the environment and natural resources, including removing obsolete language, eliminating reporting requirements, and modifying the soil and water conservation district consolidation process.

Section

- 1 **Pollution Control Agency.** Amends § 13.7411. Technical.
- 2 **Recreational vehicles and boats used for public purposes.** Amends § 84.025, subd. 10. Removes a requirement that all snowmobiles and outboard motors purchased by the DNR have four-stroke engines.
- 3 **Game warden duties; conservation officers.** Amends § 84.028, subd. 3. Technical.
- 4 **Directors.** Amends § 84.081, subd. 1. Removes the list of divisions the DNR is to be organized into and instead references the general authority of the commissioner to establish/abolish/revise divisions that is elsewhere in statute.
- 5 **Use of department resources.** Amends § 84.781. Technical.
- 6 **Permits.** Amends § 88.6435, subd. 1. Eliminates the commissioner's ability to reduce the annual fee by \$10 for bough buyer's who attend approved workshops/orientation sessions for balsam bough harvesters and buyers.

- 7 Consolidation of districts.** Amends § 103C.211. Modifies the process used to consolidate soil and water conservation districts (SWCDs) by removing the ability for districts to be divided under the petition process and removing the ability of residents to petition for a consolidation. Allows the Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR) to make the determination on whether to consolidate the districts and appoint supervisors to fill vacancies resulting from the consolidation. Allows the districts to petition to have the consolidation reversed after two years.
- 8 Supervisors elected at large.** Amends § 103C.11, subd. 1. Technical (related to SWCD consolidation process).
- 9 Powers and duties.** Amends § 103C.401, subd. 1. Technical (related to SWCD consolidation process).
- 10 Commissioner’s duties.** Amends § 103F.135, subd. 1. Technical.
- 11 Director.** Amends § 103G.005, subd. 9. Technical.
- 12 Division.** Amends § 103G.005, subd. 9. Technical.
- 13 Permit not issued until fees are paid.** Amends § 103G.315, subd. 12. Technical.
- 14 Citizen monitoring of water quality.** Amends § 115.06, subd. 4. Eliminates a report requirement of the Pollution Control Agency (PCA) that would have required, starting in 2017, a report on citizen water quality monitoring every four years.
- 15 Refuse-derived fuel.** Adds § 115A.03, subd. 25d. Adds a definition of “refuse-derived fuel” for purposes of chapter 115A (waste management).
- 16 Termination of obligations; good faith effort.** Amends § 115A.54, subd. 4. Eliminates a report requirement of the PCA that reports on the defaults/terminations under the Solid Waste Processing Facilities Capital Assistance Program (CAP).
- 17 Permitting efficiency.** Amends § 116.03, subd. 2b. Changes the permitting efficiency report requirement for the PCA from a semiannual report to an annual report.
- 18 Permits; solid waste facilities.** Amends § 116.07, subd. 4j. Removes a requirement that the PCA notify an applicant for a solid waste facility permit within 30 days whether their application is complete or not and give an estimate for how long the permit will take.
- 19 Revisor’s instruction.** Requires the revisor to update a statutory reference to reflect the repeal of section 103F.155 contained in the next section.
