Subject: Prohibiting recording people in common changing areas

Overview

This bill establishes new penalties in the interference with privacy statute for persons who, without consent, record images of others in restrooms, locker rooms, or changing rooms.

Section

1 Registration required. Requires offenders convicted of committing felony violations of the new crime created in section 2 to register as predatory offenders.

2 Nonconsensual photographs and videos.

Para. (a). Establishes criminal liability for a person who knowingly takes a photograph, records a digital image, makes a video record, or transmits live video of another person, without that person's consent, in a restroom, locker room, or changing room.

Para. (b). Establishes criminal liability for a person who knowingly disseminates, or permits to be disseminated, an image or recording made in violation of paragraph (a) $\underline{\text{or}}$ subdivision 1. (Subdivision 1 prohibits a variety of other acts of surreptitious recording in places where the victims would have a reasonable expectation of privacy.)

Para. (c). Establishes a gross misdemeanor penalty for violations of Paragraph (a) that do not involve aggravating factors.

Para. (d). Establishes a 3-year felony for violations of Paragraph (a) when the victim is a minor under the age of 18.

Para. (e). Establishes a 3-year felony for violations of Paragraph (a) when the perpetrator is a registered predatory offender.

Para. (f). Establishes a 3-year felony for violations of Paragraph (b) that do not involve aggravating factors.

Para. (g). Establishes a 5-year felony for violations of Paragraph (b) when the victim is a minor under the age of 18.

Para. (h). Establishes a 5-year felony for violations of Paragraph (b) when the perpetrator is a registered predatory offender.

Para. (i). Creates exceptions to the prohibitions contained in Paragraphs (a) and (b) for: (1) law enforcement officers; and (2) commercial establishments that post signs warning visitors that they are subject to surveillance.
