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### Overview

This bill assists victims of economic crimes. It requires the commissioner of Public Safety (DPS) to establish a victims' assistance program and authorizes issuance of identity theft passports to eligible victims.

#### Section

- 1 Financial Crimes Task Force.** Directs DPS, with the advice of the FCTF advisory board, to develop a comprehensive process to assist victims of identity theft to: (1) report crimes to the appropriate authorities, and (2) protect, correct, and restore their accounts and identity.
- 2 Victims' assistance program.** Changes from permissive to mandatory DPS's requirement to establish a victims' assistance program and provide public outreach. Requires DPS to assist identity theft victims in obtaining "identity theft passports" created under section 3.
- 3 Identity theft passport.**
  - Subd. 1.** Authorizes DPS, in cooperation with any law enforcement agency, to issue an identity theft passport to a victim of identity theft who filed a police report.
  - Subd. 2.** Outlines the application process which is initially filed with law enforcement. Law enforcement then sends the application to DPS for processing.
  - Subd. 3.** Provides that the victim may present an identity theft passport: (1) to law enforcement to help prevent the victim's arrest for a crime committed by the identity thief; or (2) to a creditor to aid in the identity theft investigation.
  - Subd. 4.** Provides that acceptance of an identity theft passport is at the discretion of the law enforcement agency or creditor.

**Subd. 5.** Classifies application data and supporting documents as private data on individuals.

**Subd. 6.** Authorizes rulemaking to implement this section.
