## Overview

Minnesota currently has four levels of licensure: Certified Minnesota Assessor, Certified Minnesota Assessor Specialist, Accredited Minnesota Assessor, and Senior Accredited Minnesota Assessor. In 2013, the legislature required assessors to become accredited. This bill removes the requirement that assessors become accredited and instead requires that they meet the level of licensure appropriate for the type of property they assess.

## **Section**

- **1 Assessor accreditation.** Removes the requirement under section 297C.9901 for assessors to become accredited Minnesota assessors and requires them instead to obtain a license appropriate for the type of property they assess, as established under section 270.48.
- 2 Assistants. Requires assistants to the assessor to obtain at least the licensure required under the proposed standard of section 270C.9901.
