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- Subject: Omnibus Liquor Bill
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Overview

This is the annual, omnibus liquor bill.

Article 1: Recodification

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This article recodifies statutes pertaining to brewers, brewpubs, and other licensed entities. The recodification was completed by the Revisor, at the request of the 2014 Legislature.

Article 2: Miscellaneous Alcohol Provisions

Section

- 1 [HF 1509, Nash.] Off-sale bottles. Allows microdistillers to sell bottles at off-sale. Sales are limited to hours for other off-sale establishments in a municipality; must be at 140 percent of the wholesale price; must be of generally available brands; must allow local retailers to share advertisements; allow only one 750 milliliter or two 375 milliliter bottles to be sold per person per day; and are limited to 12,000 liters per distiller. Enhances reporting.
- 2 Small brewer license. Allows small brewers to sell 750 milliliter bottles and growlers on Sundays. Requires a report on sales.

3	Interest in other business. Allows brewpubs to sell 750 milliliter bottles and growlers. Requires a report on amounts sold.
4	[HF 1846, Clark.] Special provision; city of Minneapolis. Allows Minneapolis to issue a liquor license for the Norway House.
5	[HF 1090, Sanders.] Intoxicating liquor. Allows an 8:00 a.m. on-sale opening time for liquor sales.
6 to 8	[House Files 1502, 469, and 86, Schultz, Atkins, and Newberger.] Golf Courses. Allows liquor licenses for golf courses in Becker, Duluth, and Inver Grove Heights.
9	[HF 1118, Hoppe.] State Fair; Brew Pub Sales. Allows brewpubs to sell kegs of beer, through wholesalers, for sale at a single location at the annual State Fair, per their licenses.
10	[HF 1937, Atkins.] Powdered Alcohol Policy Analysis. Requires testimony by state agencies on powdered alcohol; delays legal approval of powdered alcohol until June 1, 2016.
