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Subject: Increasing the Maximum Funding for Extended Time Pupils

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Overview

The current extended time revenue program allows a school district to count a student who participates in extended programming for up to an additional 0.2 students in average daily membership (ADM) for the time the student spends in extended day, extended week, summer school, or other additional programming authorized by the learning year program. This additional ADM, multiplied by \$5,017, determines extended time revenue which totals about \$65 million per year.

Prior to 2004, school districts were authorized to count students who attended school more than "full time" as more than 1.0 pupils in ADM if the student was participating in a learning year program. Since that time, ADM has been limited to the statutory cap, which is currently .2. In past years, students participating in credit recovery programs were the primary students having an average daily membership in excess of 1.2.

This bill increases the additional maximum ADM that a student could generate by participating in a learning year program from .2 to .4.

- **Average daily membership.** Increases the maximum amount of time that a student may be counted in average daily membership from 1.2 to 1.4.
- **Learning year pupil units.** Increases the maximum amount of time that a student may be counted in average daily membership from 1.2 to 1.4.

Extended time revenue. Increases the maximum average daily membership used to compute extended time revenue from .2 to .4 pupils in average daily membership.
