- Requirements. Extends workforce and training outcome reporting requirements to all education and training programs that are funded by any state funds and administered by the commissioner of DEED. Also extends requirements to education and training programs administered by the commissioner and provided to individuals enrolled in adult basic education program (ABE) or the Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP).
- 2 Uniform outcome report care; reporting by commissioner. Adds to the information on each program that must be reported to the legislature to include total program costs, program cost per participant, the cost per credential received by a participant, and the administrative costs of the programs.
- **Information.** Requires analysis by the department of specific program information collected and reported on by DEED. The analysis must include comparisons between programs on the following elements:
  - the median education level of participants;
  - participant median wage prior to enrollment in the program;
  - the number of participants enrolled in the program;
  - the number of participants receiving training under the program;
  - the number of participants that completed training;
  - the number of participants that received a credential;

• the number of participants employed during three consecutive quarters immediately following exit of the program; and

• the median wages of participants employed during three consecutive quarters immediately following exit from the program.

The data in the comparative analysis must be presented in both written and graphic format.

Workforce program net impact analysis. Adds career pathways programs to coverage under the net impact analysis
