Repealer. Repeals the Minnesota Radon Licensing Act, effective the day following final enactment.

The Minnesota Radon Licensing Act was enacted in 2015. It does the following:

- authorizes the commissioner of health to adopt rules for licensure and enforcement related to indoor radon in dwellings and other buildings, not including new residences, which are governed by section 326B.106. Also authorizes the commissioner to coordinate and implement state functions for measuring and mitigating radon in dwellings and other buildings;
- requires a radon mitigation system installed on or after October 1, 2017, to have attached to it a radon mitigation system tag provided by the commissioner;
- requires licensure of people and firms that sell devices or perform services to detect radon indoors, perform related laboratory analyses, or mitigate radon indoors, effective October 1, 2017;
- establishes fees for licenses and radon mitigation system tags; and
- authorizes the commissioner to enforce the act.
