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Overview

Community education programs are intended to maximize the community's use of public schools and to expand the involvement of community members who have skills and knowledge to share. Districts establishing a community education program must provide for a citizens' advisory council to advise the school administration on how best to use school facilities and community resources. Fees may be charged for community education programs.

Community education revenue is a partially equalized revenue consisting of basic revenue equal to \$5.42 per capita, youth service revenue equal to \$1.00 per capita, and after-school enrichment revenue equal to \$1.85 times the first 10,000 district residents and \$0.43 times the remaining districts residents.

Statewide, community education revenue equals \$40.2 million in fiscal year 2019. The community education levy raises \$39.2 million for fiscal year 2019 and state aid equals \$300,000.

H.F. 625 proposes to increase the basic per capital revenue from \$5.42 to \$7.67 per capita. This proposal has an annual state aid cost of \$1.1 million and an annual levy impact of \$11.1 million.
