### Overview

This bill requires the commissioner of corrections to develop and employ a screening tool to identify offenders who are at highest risk to commit domestic violence offenses upon release from confinement and provide programming to those offenders.

#### **Section**

#### 1

#### Targeted domestic violence prevention programming.

**Subd. 1. Screening tool.** Directs the commissioner of corrections to develop and implement a tool to identify offenders who are most likely to commit domestic violence offenses upon release from confinement.

**Subd. 2. Programming.** Requires the commissioner to provide programming consistent with best practices to offenders identified as being most likely to commit domestic violence offenses upon release from confinement.

**Subd. 3. Report.** Requires the commissioner to submit a report describing the screening tool developed pursuant to subdivision 1; the number of offenders identified as being likely to commit domestic violence offenses upon release; the number who participated in programming; and recidivism rates of released offenders, including the number who committed domestic violence offenses.

**Subd. 4. Appropriation.** Appropriates \$100,000 in fiscal years 2018 and 2019 to develop and implement the screening tool and programming identified in subdivisions 1 and 2.
