Overview

Under current law, candidates for a vacancy on the University of Minnesota's Board of Regents typically apply to the Regent Candidate Advisory Council (RCAC), a citizen council. RCAC then screens and interviews the applicants, recommending two to four candidates per vacancy to a joint legislative committee. The joint legislative committee then recommends one candidate per vacancy to the joint legislative convention, which elects regents.

This bill repeals the RCAC statute, creates a new "regent selection joint subcommittee" to recruit and recommend candidates for at-large regent positions, and establishes congressional district legislative delegations to recommend candidates for district regent positions.

Section

- 1 Regent selection joint subcommittee.** Creates a joint legislative subcommittee to recruit and recommend to the joint legislative committee one candidate for each vacant at-large position. The subcommittee consists of four members — two from each party — from each chamber's higher education committee.
- 2 Regent nomination joint committee.** Directs the joint legislative committee to consider the recommended candidates from both the joint subcommittee and the several congressional delegations.
- 3 Congressional district legislative delegation.** Provides that, for vacancies assigned to specific congressional districts, a delegation of legislators (from both chambers) representing that congressional district will recommend one candidate to the joint legislative committee.

Section

Voting must be proportional based on the population within the congressional district that each legislator represents.

4 **Repealer.** Repeals the RCAC statute.
