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Prohibits the Metropolitan Council from advertising or using as a slogan that a particular activity is a service of the council. The council may indicate that a particular activity is paid for with tax dollars.

Prohibits the council from using public money to (1) seek public support for more spending by, greater authority for, or larger appropriations to the council; or (2) assert to the public that there will be a reduction in service resulting from proposed legislative action, with the purpose of asking members of the public to oppose those actions.
