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**Subject:** Electronic Visit Verification

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### Overview

This bill modifies electronic visit verification, instructs the revisor to codify the electronic visit verification law, and repeals personal care assistant (PCA) mandated service verification.

#### Section

**1 Electronic visit verification.** Amends Laws 2017, 1<sup>st</sup> Spec. Sess. ch. 6, art. 3, § 49.

**Subd. 1. Documentation; establishment.** Modifies terminology.

**Subd. 2. Definitions.** Modifies terminology and expands the definition of “service” to include home health services and other medical supplies and equipment or home and community-based services that are required to be electronically verified by the federal 21<sup>st</sup> Century Cures Act.

**Subd. 3. Requirements.** Modifies terminology, removes obsolete language, requires the commissioner to make a state-selected electronic visit verification system available to providers of services, allows providers of services to select their own electronic visit verification system that meets the requirements established by the commissioner, and requires providers to provide data to the commissioner in a format and at a frequency to be established by the commissioner.

**Subd. 4. Legislative report.** Repeals this subdivision.

Makes this section effective the day following final enactment.

**Section**

- 2**      **Revisor's instruction.** Instructs the revisor of statutes to codify the electronic visit verification law, as amended in this act, in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 256B. Makes this section effective the day following final enactment.
  
- 3**      **Repealer.** Repeals Minnesota Statutes, section 256B.0705 (PCA mandated service verification). Makes this section effective the day following final enactment.
