Overview

This bill allows pharmacies to be paid directly by the MA program for nonscheduled injectable drugs used to treat substance abuse that are administered in an outpatient setting.

Section

1 Payment rates. Amends § 256B.0625, subd. 13e. Allows MA payment for nonscheduled injectable drugs used to treat substance abuse and administered in an outpatient setting to be paid either to the administering facility or the practitioner, or directly to dispensing pharmacy. Under current law, payment for drugs administered in an outpatient setting can be made only to the administering facility or practitioner. Requires the practitioner or administering facility to submit the claim, if the practitioner purchases the drug directly from a wholesale distributor or manufacturer. Requires the pharmacy to submit the claim, if the pharmacy dispenses the drug pursuant to a prescription issued by the practitioner and delivers the drug to the practitioner for administration. Requires the practitioner and pharmacy to ensure that claims are not duplicated and prohibits a pharmacy from dispensing a practitioner-administered injectable drug directly to an enrollee.
