Overview

This bill clarifies that local elections officials may provide "I VOTED" stickers to voters in a polling place on election day, and may also include the stickers along with the materials provided to voters who vote absentee, or who vote in a mail-only precinct.

Section

- 1 "I VOTED" stickers. Establishes the right of elections officials to provide "I VOTED" stickers, as described in the bill summary overview.
- 2 Soliciting near polling places. Clarifies that distribution of "I VOTED" stickers by local officials does not violate the law that prohibits providing or wearing a political badge, button, or insignia in a polling place on election day.
