This bill adds offenses to the list of grounds on which the Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board may refuse to issue, refuse to renew, or automatically revoke a teacher's license to teach without the right to a hearing. The bill adds a cross-reference to this list in the statutes that require a school board to discharge a teacher, effective immediately, upon receipt of notice of a licensing action based on certain criminal convictions.

PELSB must also refuse to renew, or revoke a teacher's license if the teacher has been convicted of a felony or gross misdemeanor involving a minor, though a teacher may petition the board to reconsider its decision on these grounds.
