Overview

This bill regulates security screening systems in general and, specifically, as they are used in correctional facilities.

Summary

Section	Description
1	<p>Fees for ionizing radiation-producing equipment.</p> <p>Requires facilities that use radiation producing security screening systems to pay the commissioner of health \$100 for each system in use. This fee is in addition to the \$100 base registration fee. Defines “security screening system” for purposes on this section as “radiation-producing equipment designed and used for security screening of humans who are in the custody of a correctional or detention facility, and used by the facility to image and identify contraband items concealed within or on all sides of a human body”.</p>
2	<p>Exemption from examination requirements; operators of security screening systems.</p> <p>Exempts security screening systems used in correctional facilities as well as the operators of these systems from certain statutory and regulatory requirements (e.g. operator need not have passed a national exam for limited x-ray machine operation) and enforced by the Department of Health.</p>
3	<p>Appropriation.</p> <p>Appropriates \$29,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$21,000 in fiscal year 2021 from the state government special revenue fund to the commissioner of health.</p>
