

Subject Elk River local sales tax

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Overview

Allows the city of Elk River to impose a local sales tax of one-half of one percent to finance \$35 million plus associated bond costs for a number of specific park and recreational facilities projects. The tax expires at the earlier of 25 years or when allowed revenues are raised.

1	<p>City of Elk River tax authorized.</p> <p>Subd. 1. Sales and use tax authorization. Based on approval by the voters at the 2018 general election, allows the city to impose a local sales and use tax of one-half of one percent to fund the projects described in subdivision 2.</p> <p>Subd. 2. Use of sales and use tax revenues. Allows the city to finance \$35 million, plus associated bond costs, for the following recreational projects:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ a multipurpose recreational facility such as an ice arena, community meeting and activity space, and an artificial turf field house;▪ senior center facility improvements;▪ Lion John Weicht Park improvements;▪ Lions Park Center improvements;▪ a picnic pavilion addition;▪ youth athletic complex improvements;▪ Orono Park improvements;▪ dredging of Lake Orono; and▪ citywide trail connections.

Section	Description
	<p>Subd. 3. Bonding authority. Allows the city to issue up to \$35 million in bonds to fund the projects in subdivision 2 without another referendum. Excludes the bonds from the city's debt limits.</p>
	<p>Subd. 4. Termination of tax. The tax terminates at the earlier of ten years or when the city has received an amount equal to \$35 million plus associated bond costs. Any extra revenues after payment of the projects and bonds, due to the requirement that local taxes terminate at the end of calendar quarter, shall go to the city general fund. The city council may terminate the tax earlier if desired.</p>
	<p>Effective upon the city complying with the approval and filing requirements for special laws.</p>



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
