## **Overview**

Expands the existing requirements and penalties related to railroad crossings and trains to include other on-track equipment as well.

# **Summary**

Section	Description	
1	Requirements.	

Expands the requirements for when a person driving a motor vehicle must not cross a railroad grade crossing in the presence or approach of a train to also include the presence or approach of other on-track equipment.

#### 2 Pedestrians; penalties.

Extends the penalty for pedestrians who ignore barriers, signals, and warning sounds for the approach, passage, or departure of a train to the approach, passage, or departure of other on-track equipment.

#### 3 Certain vehicles to stop at railroad crossings.

Requires school buses and other vehicles required to stop at railroad crossing due to trains under federal regulation to follow the same requirements for stopping for other on-track equipment.

Also requires other on-track equipment to follow the same procedure as trains when crossing an exempt crossing. Exempt crossings occur on rail lines that have been abandoned or have fewer than five trains a year, all traveling at reduced speeds.

### 4 Crossing railroad tracks with certain equipment.

Requires persons crossing a rail line on heavy equipment or similar slow moving vehicle to follow the same procedures for other on-track equipment as for trains.
