## Overview

H.F. 3246 would modify the definition of a microdistillery to include distillers producing 100,000 proof gallons of spirits per year or less and would allow expanded off-sale of spirits by a microdistillery, but only for those microdistilleries at or below the current 40,000 proof production limit.

| 1 | <b>Microdistillery.</b><br>Increases the production limit to qualify as a microdistillery from 40,000 proof gallons annually to 100,000.  |
| 2 | <b>Off-sale license.</b><br>Limits off-sale of spirits by microdistilleries to only those distilleries producing 40,000 or fewer proof gallons of spirits per year, but allows off-sale of spirits in amounts up to 4.5 liters per customer per day. The current limit is 375 milliliters per customer per day. |
